Independent Living Program

Working one-on-one with individuals with disabilities to assist them with reaching their independent living goals

HOW THIS PROMOTES INDEPENDENCE

Provides tools and knowledge to secure employment, maintain a budget, utilize public transportation, gain accommodations for education, find affordable housing, advocate for parental rights, and more

Work Incentives Training

Offering Work Incentives Planning and Assistance (WIPA) services to individuals with disabilities

HOW THIS PROMOTES INDEPENDENCE

Provides beneficiaries with disabilities accurate information about their benefits to make a successful transition to work

EQUIP

Encouraging self-advocacy, disability pride, and development of professional skills

HOW THIS PROMOTES INDEPENDENCE

Empowers youth with disabilities to advocate for their personal and professional goals, get involved in their community, and raise their expectations of future achievements

Educating individuals with disabilities to take control of their health

Teaches individuals with disabilities adaptive exercises, easy healthy recipes, and tips for managing stress in their daily lives

South Carolina Supported Decision-Making Project

Teaching professionals and families about options to protect the rights of individuals with disabilities while promoting autonomy

Educates on alternatives to guardianship that promote independence, allowing individuals with disabilities the freedom to make their own decisions

Meet Angaliece: A mom who almost had her baby taken away, only because she had a disability



Our executive director Kimberly Tissot with Angaliece

Angaliece is a mom with Down Syndrome and a rape survivor. After her child was born — who also had Down Syndrome — a private action was filed to remove her baby from her custody even though she had the proper supports in place. We advocated for Angaliece through the SC Persons with Disabilities Right to Parent Act. We also worked closely with the Department of Social Services and a Guardian Ad Litem within the court system to reach a settlement. Angaliece and her baby are now reunited.
