The COMET Bus System

The COMET (Central Midlands Transit) operates 34 fixed routes, 12 UofSC Transit routes and five ReFlex routes as a hub and spoke system in Richland and Lexington Counties. Many of the routes operate through COMET Central, as well as other Super Stops throughout the service area. The COMET's Newberry and Lower Richland Express details are below.

Newberry Express

93X express runs a morning and evening trip between Newberry and Columbia. It is operated by The COMET.

Lower Richland Express

44X express runs a morning and evening trip between Sumter, Eastover, Hopkins, and Columbia. It is operated by The COMET.

The COMET Special Programs



DART

To qualify for DART service, applicants must be unable to reasonably access and/or use The COMET fixed route system independently. Those who wish to use the DART system can be certified as eligible by completing an application and following the short eligibility review process.



COMET to the Market

Seven days a week between 6 a.m. and 8 p.m., apply the promo code COMETMARKET20 on Lyft and your trip must originate or end at the following fresh food markets: Walmart & Walmart Neighborhood Market, BiLo, Kroger, The Fresh Market, Whole Foods Market, Aldi, Food Lion, Gourmet Shoppe, La Estrella Supermarket, Lowe's Fresh Food, Ole Timey Meat Market, Piggy Wiggly, Publix, Rosewood Market & Deli, Sam's Club, Costco, Save-A-Lot, State Farmers Market, Target, Trader Joes, and Supermercado El Mariachi.



COMET Vanpool

Through the "Commute with Enterprise" program, The COMET subsidizes up to \$500 per month for the use of a vanpool.



Soda Cap Connector

The COMET's Soda Cap Connector is a downtown shuttle intended for tourists and locals to hop from district to district in the urban core of Columbia for only \$1.00 per ride. This service travels between Five Points, Main Street and The Congaree Vista District over the river into Cayce and West Columbia. The Soda Cap also runs seasonally to Segra Park, home of the single-A baseball team, the Columbia Fireflies, located within the BullStreet District during home games.



COMET @ Night

Seven days a week between 8 p.m. and 6 a.m., apply the promo code which is available on board the inside of The COMET buses to get the up to \$8.00 discount.



Blue Bike SC

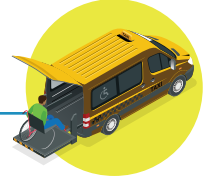
V-TRIP

The COMET offers an opportunity to people with disabilities and people 65 years and older to pay the friends and neighbors that drive them. The person must live in Richland or Lexington County in the Columbia Urbanized Area outside The COMET service area and complete a training and application process.



FoodShare SC On-The-Go

FoodShare South Carolina has teamed up with The COMET to increase fresh food access and affordability for transit riders in Columbia. This program allows passengers with busy schedules to connect to fresh produce at COMET Central.



PUP

The COMET offers \$50 in taxi or rideshare funds for trips to people with disabilities and people 65 years and older. The person must live in Richland or Lexington County in the Columbia Urbanized Area outside The COMET service area and complete a training and application process.



Food delivery partnerships

The COMET provides food delivery for non-profit organizations in partnership with Senior Resources, FoodShare SC and Axiom Farms Cooperative. Customers interested in having food delivered to them by The COMET must contact the participating organizations directly.

Discounted Fare and Program Discounts

Qualifying identification for discount fare includes:

- Seniors age 65 & older (Senior driver's license/state ID card)
- Veterans (Military ID card or VA Veterans ID card)
- Persons with disabilities (The COMET half fare ID card)
- Medicare card holders
- Youth 16 to 18 years old with The COMET half fare ID card

- DART eligible customers ride fixed-route free with DART ADA ID card.
- Students, employees and/or affiliates of McEntire Produce, Richland One, Richland Two, Lexington/Richland Five, Columbia College, Allen University, Midlands Technical College, Lexington Medical Center and Prisma Health can ride The COMET for free by showing their ID card.
- UofSC Students, employees and/or affiliates can ride ONLY UofSC Transit for free. The COMET routes and services require a fare.
- Interlined routes do not require an additional fare.
- The COMET employees, board members and transit operations contractor employees ride free.
- Children through 15 years old ride free. Children taller than 39 inches through 15 years old must have The COMET half fare ID card to ride free.
- SWRTA and Fairfield County Transit System customers with a transfer receive one free transfer on The COMET. The COMET customers with a DayPass or transfer receive one free transfer on SWRTA at joint stops only.
- Children age 10 years old or older can ride unattended. Children under 10 years old must have a fare paying passenger age 16 years old or older.
- Class Pass – \$45.00 (Up to 5 adults and 40 students at \$1.00 per ride).
- The COMET Half Fare ID Card – first card is free, lost card fee is \$5.00.
- One Personal Care Attendant (PCA) for a person with a disability rides free. All other companions pay fare for their category.
- COMETCard – \$2.00 for first card, \$5.00 for lost card. Use for transfers between buses and to load 1-Day, 7-Day and 31-Day Passes.
- U-Passes are available during Spring (January 1 to May 31), Summer (May 1 to August 31) and Fall (August 1 to December 31) semester.
 - ▶ Spring and Fall U-Passes are \$80.00 and decrease \$20.00 each month.
 - ▶ Summer U-Passes are \$60.00 and decrease \$20.00 each month.
 - ▶ Proof of college enrollment required.
 - ▶ Passes are only sold at COMET Central and Midlands Technical College – Beltline Campus.

City Rover is also known as “Yellow Shirts.” They provide a free shuttle spanning 36 blocks of Main Street. The shuttle service operates Monday through Sunday at 7:30am to 11pm at night. This service is temporarily suspended due to COVID.

- 2. Taxi Services** have to be called or requested via app. They are an accessible alternative to Uber and Lyft but the accessible vehicles have to be requested at least 24 hours in advance. Checker Yellow Taxi Cab, the Original Blue Ribbon, and Capitol City are the three largest taxi companies in the Central Midlands.
