Pre-Employment Skill Classes

We serve students with disabilities across the Midlands and the Upstate to prepare them for employment and life after high school.

- We offer engaging hands-on lessons for inperson classes, and host exciting live virtual lessons
- Curriculums are a series of weekly 45-minute sessions
- Lessons are taught by peers in the disability community and young professionals from diverse backgrounds
- Lessons are universally designed for accessibility, can be integrated into any classroom, and work alongside any existing accommodations

One Day Workshop

This 20-25 person 5-hour workshop is facilitated in one day and is filled with fun activities and lessons. The lessons are designed to build disability pride and self-advocacy and prepare students with disabilities for employment and life after high school.

SC Youth Leadership Forum

YOUTH LEADERSHIP FORUM

South Carolina Youth Leadership Forum (SC YLF) is a unique multi day overnight summer leadership learning experience that empowers and enhances the leadership and self-advocacy skills of young adults with disabilities. This program is funded through the SC Developmental Disabilities Council.

- Delegates participate in hands-on activities with peers, mentors, lawmakers, and successful role models with disabilities
- Open to young adults with any type of disability, ages 15-23
- Delegates are selected based on an application and interview

Youth Independent Living Skills Training

We equip youth with disabilities with the tools they need to reach their goals. Our services increase their independent living skills, confidence level, and overall adaptability skills. Our staff have been there and know the obstacles they may face.

- Peer mentoring can be done virtually or in person, and is designed to help young adults with disabilities set concrete, personal, and realistic goals
- Skills training we offer include: adjustment and adapting to disability, disability pride, self-advocacy, daily living skills, healthy relationships, supported decision making, and more!
- After setting clear goals, participants are be paired with Youth Independent Living Specialists, professionals equipped with resources and focused on empowerment

Equip Programs

Hangouts

Our Leaders host monthly hangouts where youth with disabilities make friends, build new skills, and learn about self-advocacy and disability pride.

- Monthly In-person hangouts are in our offices in Columbia and Greenville. Join our monthly virtual hangout online!

Community Activities

We also host community hangouts, designed to help youth with disabilities engage with the community, learn about local resources, and build their social skills in a peer-to-peer setting.
